

City Council Approves \$6,500 For WinterFest Celebration

The rising costs of fireworks displays and event insurance brought Colfax Area Chamber of Commerce president Tim Ryan to the city council on November 9 requesting \$6,500 to help fund this year's WinterFest on Saturday, December 10. Ryan said those costs were up 25% and that the Chamber would be spending \$10,000 on the event.

Free Chipping Through December

If you still have piles that need chipping, Placer County has announced that its chipper program will be free through the end of December.

The county chipping service is a cost-share program, funded by Placer County and CAL FIRE, that provides low-cost residential chipper service for Placer County residents, incentivizes fuels reduction, and promotes defensible space adherence and fire prevention activities.

The usual fee for chipping is \$80/hour.

To request service, call (530) 889-0111, Ext. 3 and leave a message with your name, site address, phone number, and location of the brush pile to be chipped. After city manager Wes Heathcock confirmed the money was in the city's budget, the council voted 4-0 in favor with no discussion. Mayor pro tem Mendoza was absent from the meeting.

The council also heard a presentation from the Placer County Transportation Planning Agency (PCTPA) regarding the annual Unmet Transit Needs Assessment (UTN) and adoption of the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) as required every five years.

The Colfax Roundabout and its new westbound on-ramp were funded via the last RTP.

The RTP is a long-range transportation-funding plan. It identifies the priorities for addressing existing and future traffic congestion, mobility needs, and maintenance of the transportation

Placer Supervisors Approve Bear River Campground Agreement

On Tuesday, November 29, the Placer County Board of Supervisors voted unanimously to approve a memorandum of understanding (MOU) for a one-year agreement for management of the Bear River Campground as an exclusive day-use area.

In preparation for the transition to day use only, the county has removed picnic tables, fire pits, barbecues and campground signs. The county will have the option of extending the MOU for a second year.

While the MOU is in force, rest room cleaning, trash pickup, and the ranger patrol service will continue, as will patrols by the Placer County Sheriff's Office. California Fish and Wildlife will take responsibility for land and vegetation management. Trails and mining in the Bear River will continue under the same day-use rules as before.

infrastructure. Also priorities for services located in the incorporated cities of Roseville, Rocklin, Lincoln, Auburn, and Colfax, the town of Loomis, and unincorporated areas of Placer County (excluding the Lake Tahoe basin).

The next Regional Transportation Plan extends the Placer region's planning expectations for transportation investments to 2050. The 2050 RTP planning effort will re-examine and update the prior RTP's goals and policies as needed, will also address any new state and/or federal planning requirements and/or funding sources adopted since 2019. Completion of the 2050 RTP should occur by December 2024. The Unmet Transit Needs Assessment will be adopted at the PCTPA's February 2023 meeting.
