New City Manager, Ronald Walker, Hired On 4-0 Vote

After a six-month search following the departure of city manager Wes Heathcock in June, the Colfax city council voted unanimously on November 29 to hire Ronald Walker to fill the position. Walker will take over January 15 and Mike Luken, who was hired as interim city manager on July 1, will depart after a 2-week transition period on January 29, 2024.

Councilmember Hillberg was not present at the meeting.

Luken said that Colfax was fortunate to have a number of highly qualified candidates available to assume this position. An Ad Hoc Committee of Mayor Burruss and Mayor Pro-Tem Douglass, and the full City Council held interviews with potential candidates in late October and early November.

"Interim city manager Mike Luken and former city manager Wes Heathcock have built a great foundation to work from here," Walker said. "There's a lot of good things happening so I won't be starting from zero."

Colfax and the surrounding area appealed to his passion for historic mining communities. "This area has a rich history and rugged beauty with no end to the recreational pssibilities. It just seems like a wonderful

place," he said. The 58-year-old Walker has 30 years experience in public works, infrastructure project

management, budgetary management and recently served as the Director of Public Works for Live Oak, California, a small city of approximately 4,165 people in Sutter County.

He said that he has 25 years of experience with wastewater treatment, and has run a class 4 treatment plant.

Walker also has a BA in Business Administration with an emphasis in Public Policy from South New Hampshire University and brings a wealth of management experience to the City of Colfax.

He said the first step to taking over his new position will be navigating the local political landscape. "Building positive relationships and trust with community members, staff and

council is always a challenge." He has been extremely involved in wastewater systems like Colfax's wastewater treatment plan. He holds a Grade 5 Operators License, the highest license available in California, and also has a Class B operators' certificate for driving heavy equipment and holds FEMA emergency management certifications.

Walker said that he considers himself a problem solver who will work with staff to find solutions for whatever problems arise. "Everything is a learning experience," he said. "And as long as you're learning from your failures you're doing okay."

Following the council's approval, Walker will assume his duties on January 15, 2024. Luken will provide a part-time transition period to help Walker get acclimated and then will leave at the end of January.

During the meeting the council also unanimously passed contracts for firms upgrading the algae reduction project and inflow & infiltration projects for the sewer system, submission of planning grant application to the State for the Shady Glen sewer consolidation project, eliminating the Public Works Director and Administrative Analyst positions, adding an Administrative Services Officer position, adopting the 2040 general plan update/FEIR and waiver of the first reading of Ordinance 556 to update the zoning code and zoning map to be in conformance with the new general plan.


Peace, Inside & Out


