Council Approves Funding For Moving The Caboose, Winterfest 2024

Due to the Thanksgiving holiday later in the month, the November 13 city council meeting was the only meeting scheduled for the month. Likewise, the Christmas holiday will cancel the second meeting in December.

The meeting was called to order at 6 p.m. with all council members present. They moved quickly to approve the consent calendar and on to agency reports, where PCSO Sgt. Williams introduced himself as the new Colfax station commander. CHP's Jason Lyman reported on the snarled traffic over the summit that temporarily closed sections of I-80 during the season's first

snow storm. He advised drivers to slow down when driving in winter conditions.

A contract with Eco Green Solutions (EGS) to replace existing outdoor lighting at the Lions Children's Park and the Sheriff's substation with LED lights was the agenda's sole presentation. And, at no cost to the city because EGS will take advantage of all applicable PG&E rebates and incentives. With little discussion the item passed easily on a 4-0-1 vote, with council member Trinity Burruss abstaining.

There were two items on the Public Hearing agenda: a short-term rental (STR) planning deposit fee schedule amendment; and three zoning code amendments.


City planner Kathy Pease said that passing the STR fee amendment would set the new permit fee at \$350.00, and the annual renewal fee at \$85.00. She said those levels would insure the recovery of all city costs to administer the STR program. After one member of the public spoke in favor of the proposed amendment the council sealed the deal with a 5-0 approval vote.

Pease described the proposed three zoning code amendments as "a clean-up of the existing ordinance" by adding three new definitions, as follows:

Employee Housing is privately-owned housing that provides living quarters in connection with any work, whether or not rent is involved.

A **Low-Barrier Navigation Center** (LBNC) is a Housing First, low barrier, temporary, service-enriched shelter that helps homeless individuals and families to quickly obtain permanent housing. It differs from homeless shelters in that it provides onsite services intended to provide long term housing solutions.

Single Room Occupancy (SRO) is a single furnished room that can be rented month-to-month or for a more extended period.

Pease said if the council approved the first reading of the proposed amendments, the second reading would occur at the Dec.11 meeting. The council responded with a unanimous vote to approve.

Former mayor Tom Parnham went to the public podium during Public Comment to ask the council to do something about all the free-range chickens loose on West Oak St.


The two pieces of official business both involved requests for city funding.

The project to move the caboose over to the Depot Green got a boost when the council voted unanimously to donate \$5,000.00 to the effort. Moving the caboose will be the first step to creating an outdoor Rail Heritage Museum in Colfax.

The Chamber of Commerce asked the city for \$7,000.00 to fund the annual WinterFest event coming up on Saturday, December 14 in downtown Colfax. The council approved the request with another unanimous vote. With that Mayor Douglass closed the open meeting and the council moved into a closed session at 7:14 p.m.


While the trunks were the main attraction, thre was lots to see in kids as well as parents who suited up to make for fun and scary viewing.


