City Council Approves Donation To Sierra Soar On 3-1 Vote

The issue of donating money to the Sierra Soar non-profit organization to refurbish the community center gym appeared

on the city council agenda for a fifth and final time at the September 24 meeting. As he has in the past, Sierra Soar spokesman Bob Morales made a brief introduction asking for

the remaining \$2,800 from the \$5,000 he originally asked for at the May 25 council meeting.

Council member Trinity Burruss was absent from the meeting.

When Morales was done. council member Larry Hillberg moved to give him the money. Council member Caroline Mc-Cully objected, estimating that a gift of \$2,800 would leave less than \$4,000 in the city's nonprofit donation fund for the rest of the current fiscal year. A brief discussion ensued, followed by a 3-1 vote in favor of giving Sierra Soar the \$2,800. McCully was the lone vote against it.

Prior to settling the Sierra Soar

- donation issue, the council discussed developing a new city policy for non-profit donations to assure accountability, fairness, and proper use of city funds. Included in a list of potential regulations were:
- Written agreements (MOUs or contracts)
- Use restrictions
- Transparency and reporting
- Audit and oversight
- Donation caps and limits
- Non-discrimination and public benefit clauses.

The council raised questions about the feasibility of auditing non-profit organizations,

lim Bowers' Latest Idea: A Choo Choo Clock

Well-known local artist Jim Bowers, holder of the world's record for designing and building the largest, working clock, joined the ongoing conversation about bringing more tourists to Colfax at the September 24 city council meeting.

Staying with a clock motif, Bowers presented his idea for what he calls a "Choo Choo Clock" that he wants to build over the stage in the 'Lot of Arts' park on South Main St. in downtown Colfax.

Bowers made a short presentation during public comment and brought a concept sketch of his idea (see above). Basically, every hour on the hour a model train would come out of a tunnel and circle the horizontal clock face. During daylight hours the train would also blow its whistle.

The idea will appear on a future council agenda for an open discussion. The drawing isn't to scale, but gives a good idea for the size of the clock.

whether potential donation recipients must be 501(c3) non-profits, whether to require some level of matching funds (40% and 50% were mentioned) from donation recipients, and how to deal with local artists needing funds for smaller projects. There was general agreement that donations must be used exclusively for the purpose approved by the city council.

The eventual city donation policy could also include having donation recipients enter into a memorandum of understanding with the city specifying the approved use of the donation, reporting and accountability requirements, a timeline for the use of the funds, and repayment provision, if the funds are misused.

There was no vote taken, as this was a non-action item for providing direction to staff. It will likely reappear on the council agenda for more discussion and a potential vote at a future meeting.

The Sierra Soar/Colfax Boys Basketball Program was back on the city council agenda for a fourth time at the **September 10 meeting,** as the only piece of official business.

Council member Trinity Burruss was absent from the meeting, which was conducted without a sound sytem or broadcast capability due to technical difficulties.

At the June 11, 2025 meeting council member Larry Hillberg moved to donate \$5,000.00 to the non-profit organization Sierra Soar in support of the Colfax

Boys Basketball Program. The Council could only approve a donation of \$2,200, however, because that's all there was left in the city's donation fund at the time.

The funds were designated specifically for program use and not for upgrades to the community center basketball facilities that Sierra Soar planned to make. Those upgrades included new backboards, school logos on the gym walls and a refurbished gym floor, all for an estimated cost of \$14,000.

The Colfax Boys Basketball Program has been teaching local boys to play basketball for 62 years, fielding school teams that have won 17 league championships and 5 section titles.

At that same meeting, the council also appointed an ad hoc Committee to negotiate a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the community center for the city's right

of access before any of the city donation could be used for improvements to the facility. Hillberg and Burruss, the ad hoc committee members, reported that the MOU was not ready at the council's August 13 meeting.

After mayor Sean Lomen opened the item, Hillberg immediately stated that he was in favor of giving Sierra Soar the \$2,800 it was asking for. Referring to the community center, council member Caroline McCully expressed her reluctance to donate city funding to benefit an organiztion "that has lied and misrepresents itself" without explaining what she meant.

The discussion went downhill from there and was eventually tabled on a motion from council member Kim Douglass, to be brought back at the September 24 meeting when a full council might be present.

Earlier in the meeting, via the Consent Calendar, the council approved an MOU with the International Union of Operating Engineers that gave city union members a 2% equity increase, reduced the salary structure from an 11-step model to a six-step model, and increased stand-by pay from \$3.00 to \$4.00 dollars per hour on a 4-0 vote. The agreement will be retroactive to July 1, 2025.


