1 CALL REGULAR MEETING TO ORDER

The Regular Council Meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM by Mayor Douglass.

1A. **The Pledge of Allegiance** was led by Officer Chris Nave of the California Highway Patrol.

2 **ACTION ITEMS**

2A. Reject all bids for the Grass Valley Street Utility Undergrounding Project and cancel project

STAFF PRESENTATION: Jim Fletter, Assistant City Engineer

RECOMMENDATION: 1) Adopt Resolution 18-2015 Rejecting all bids for the Grass Valley Street Utility Undergrounding Project No. 14-01 and authorize the City Clerk to return bid securities to bidders; 2) Receive accounting of funds expended to date on the project.

Assistant City Engineer Fletter explained that the City received good construction bids for the Utility Undergrounding Project. After bids were opened, PG&E revised their cost estimate to a final budget. Wave Cable and Verizon had originally agreed to be part of the project, but when the final costs were given, both declined to support the project. If the Project is built without Wave Cable and Verizon, the City would expend \$100,000. Staff recommends canceling the project at this time due to the high expense. Council asked if the design was completed without approval of all of the utilities and if the \$35,000 investment in design will be recouped in the future should the project be approved at a later date. City Manager Miller replied that the utilities had given approval of the design but do not want to pay the costs of the trench. The project is fully designed so the plans can be used at a future date. There were no comments from the public.

On a motion by Councilmember Delfino, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Parnham the City Council adopted Resolution 18-2015 rejecting all bids for the Grass Valley Street Utility Undergrounding Project.

2B. Reject bid and authorize staff to re-bid, for the UPRR Ped Xing and Bike Path Improvement Project, Federal Project No. STPL – 5187(007)

STAFF PRESENTATION: Jim Fletter, Assistant City Engineer

RECOMMENDATION: 1) Reject the bid received for the UPRR Ped Xing and Bike Path Improvement Project No. 12-01.02; 2) authorize the City Clerk to return the bid security; and 3) authorize staff to re-advertise for bids.

Assistant City Engineer Jim Fletter stated that only one bid came in for the project at \$346,000, about \$100,000 higher than the engineer's estimate of \$210,000. He subsequently received information from contractors that they would enter a bid if the City re-advertised for bids. Council discussed the item, expressing consternation that the project has been in the planning phase for several years and concern that only one company put in a bid. City Engineer Alan Mitchell explained that the project is complicated. Environmental and safety requirements from the Railroad, the State and the Federal government have all created delays. Some companies did not bid for the project due to the high cost of obtaining insurance for a project involving railroad property. City Manager Miller stated that the Union Pacific Railroad has a source of pooled insurance which will lower the cost for potential bidders. The engineers asserted that new bids could be opened within twenty-one days. Members of the public inquired how this has impacted the City budget and if the potential Quiet Zone has been affected. The project is funded through grants not by general City funds and the Quiet Zone is still possible

On a motion by Councilmember Delfino, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Parnham the City Council rejected the bid and authorized staff to re-bid the UPRR Ped Xing and Bike Path Improvement Project, Federal Project No. STPL_5187(007)

4A. Committee Reports and Informational Items – All Council Members Mayor Douglass

 Project Go is considering purchasing 70 copies of HMIS software to create a common database for the local agencies which offer services to the homeless.
 Over 200 agencies and organizations provide services and there is currently no method of communicating among them.

Councilmember Harvey

• Commented that with the Wastewater Treatment Plant configured for maintenance and low flow, it would be an ideal time to hire a new operator. He inquired when Staff would begin the recruitment for the new operator. City Manager Miller responded that the current contractor is over budget but cost effective. The Public Works Department employees have passed Operator 1 and Operator 2 certificates, respectively. Staff will begin the recruitment process soon.

Councilmember Parnham

- Attended the Mosquito Abatement meeting with nothing to report pertaining to Colfax.
- The Memorial Day Service held at the Cemetery was a nice event.

Councilmember Delfino

• WACMAC was cancelled so there is nothing to report.

4B. Operations Updates – City Staff

City Manager Miller

- As a result of the abatement letter sent earlier this year, the owners of the Historic Hotel have contacted us and the Hotel is back on the market. The City will continue the abatement process.
- The Dollar General construction contractor purchased his business license this week. There is no date set for the start of construction but the project is moving forward.
- A flyer for the Placer County Agricultural Tour has been placed in Council's boxes it is usually an interesting and worthwhile event.
- The Wastewater Treatment Plant is producing very clear water and pond 2 will be cleaned during the reconfiguration of the plant for the summer.
- The Sierra Vista Community Center will be hosting the second annual Chocolate, Wine, and Art Indulgence on June 27th.
- On June 2nd, Placer County will host a Travel and Leisure Symposium from 11:00AM-2:00PM.

4C. Additional Reports – Agency Partners

Chris Nave, California Highway Patrol (CHP) Public Information Officer

- Memorial Day weekend was busy for CHP with several DUI arrest and accidents.
- A Bike Rodeo will be held on May 29th at the Alta/Dutch Flat School from 12:00-2:30PM. About 80 children will participate.
- CHP is promoting the Sober Grad Night at the Sierra Vista Community Center.
- CHP is planning to hold Coffee-with-a-Cop events at Starbucks soon. He will inform Council when details are available.

Mayor Pro Tem Parnham asked if the increase of wrong-way drivers on the freeway were a result of confusion due to road construction. Officer Nave replied that the statistics show that 61% are a result of DUI and most of the remainder are disoriented Senior Citizens – there is no proven correlation between wrong-way drivers and road construction.

Frank Klein, Colfax Chamber of Commerce President

- The next Chamber Mixer will be at Sierra Self Storage on June 25th from 5:30PM-7:30PM.
- The Chamber is working on the July 3 application and may possibly have a fundraising event on June 13th.

5 PUBLIC COMMENT

Melba Delfino, 999 Pine Street:

- Kiwanis will once again hold a Little Patriots Parade on July 3rd at 11:30AM. Usually 12-25 children participate in the parade.
- She inquired how the recruitment for the office administrative assistant position was going.

Jeannie Claxton, 285 Alpine Way:

- Suggested that Council and the Chamber work together to create a list of businesses which could be given to passengers waiting for the train in order to draw people across the tracks and into downtown businesses.
- She also suggested that the City encourage the organizers of the Century Bike ride to route the ride through Colfax.

Tim Ryan, 300 S Main Street:

- He was impressed with the potential City Hall makeover and encouraged Council to improve the building's façade to continue the momentum from the workshop.
- Commented that the flags flying in downtown on Memorial Day looked great.

6 **PUBLIC HEARING**

6A. Introduction and First Reading of Ordinance No. 526: An Ordinance Of The City Of Colfax Authorizing Collection Of Delinquent Sewer Service Charges On The Placer County Secured Tax Roll For Fiscal Year 2015-2016 STAFF PRESENTATION: Laurie Van Groningen, Finance Director RECOMMENDED ACTION: Introduce the proposed Ordinance by title only, conduct a Public Hearing and thereafter by Motion waive the first reading and Continue for Second Reading and Adoption at the June 10th Regularly Scheduled Council Meeting to be effective 30 days thereafter.

City Manager Miller stated that the hearing for delinquent Recology accounts was held at City Hall during regular business hours. No one came to speak at the hearing.

Finance Director Laurie Van Groningen stated that this hearing is part of the normal annual process established to place delinquent sewer accounts on the property tax rolls. The hearing has been properly noticed and property owners have been notified by mail. Councilmember Harvey asked why some of the delinquent accounts were unsecured. City Attorney Cabral explained that these accounts were for the buildings on railroad land. There is a different process to place these on the tax rolls.

On a motion by Councilmember Delfino, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Parnham the City Council approved the Introduction and First Reading of Ordinance No. 526 by title only and continued the Hearing for the Second Reading at the June 10, 2015 Regularly Scheduled Meeting.

7A. Animal Control Contract Renewal

STAFF PRESENTATION: Mark Miller, City Manager

RECOMMENDATION: Approve and Adopt Resolution 20-2015: Authorizing the City Manager to execute an agreement with Placer County Department of Health and Human Services for Animal Control and Care Services from July 1, 2015-June 30, 2017.

City Manager Miller stated that the City has contracted with Placer County for Animal Control services for many years. The County provides a variety of services, dealing with encroachments of wild animals and barking dogs. The County also houses animals that are displaced due to disasters. The price has been reduced slightly from last year's contract. He gave each Councilmember a packet of statistics regarding animal control. Councilmember Delfino expressed concern that the wording of the contract for the second year allowed for an adjustment in price without giving a definite amount. City Manager Miller explained that adjustments are generally due to salary changes and none are anticipated soon. The contract can be canceled at any time with thirty days' notice.

On a motion by Mayor Pro Tem Parnham, seconded by Mayor Douglass the City Council adopted Resolution 20-2015.

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RECOMMENDED ACTION: Adopt Resolution 21-2015.

SUMMARY:

Required approvals and documentation for annual process of placing liens upon property taxes for delinquent waste collections accounts.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The recommended action does not expose the City to liability to Recology. Amounts collected by the County and remitted to the City will be paid to Recology to satisfy the amounts owed. The City does not become liable to remit any funds to Recology until the County disburses collected funds to the City.

BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS:

Subscription to and payment for refuse collection service in Colfax is mandatory. The Council adopted Ordinance 517 amending Colfax Municipal Code (the "Code") Section 8.20.130 to allow delinquent accounts for refuse service to be collected on the County tax rolls at the same time as ad valorem property taxes.

There are approximately 23 delinquent accounts that remain unpaid. A written report containing a description of each parcel of real property for which there is a delinquent refuse service charge and the amount of each charge has been prepared and filed with the City Clerk in accordance with the Code and is attached.

On May 27, 2015, the City held a hearing to consider all protests or objections to the written report. The owner of each property listed in the report was provided at least 10 days written notice (copy of letter sent by Recology attached to this report) of the date, time and place of the hearing. Having conducted the required hearing, staff recommends that the Council adopt the written report as presented.

If the Council confirms the report as recommended, the City Clerk will file it with the County Auditor-Controller and the charges reflected in the final report will be collected at the same time as ad valorem property taxes. This will include collection of City administrative charges and a rate of 1% payable to the County to offset the cost of their administrative services.

Resolution № 21-2015

CONFIRMING THE REPORT OF DELINQUENT WASTE COLLECTION ACCOUNTS AND PLACING LIENS ON SAID PROPERTIES AND SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS UPON PROPERTY TAXES PURSUANT TO CITY OF COLFAX MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 8.20.130.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Colfax Municipal Code Title 8, Chapter 8.20, subscription to, and payment for, Waste Collection Service for all occupied properties in the City of Colfax is mandatory; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of the Colfax Municipal Code, each owner of property for which there is a delinquency in payment for refuse collection services has been notified in writing of their obligation to subscribe to waste collection services and make payment for that service; and

WHEREAS, said property owners have been notified in writing of the commencement of lien proceedings; and

WHEREAS, Waste Collection Service has been provided by Recology Auburn Placer to all properties described in the report attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and each of said properties remains delinquent in the payment for waste collection services in the amounts reflected in Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, said property owners have failed to make payments for sixty days or more for waste collection services as required; and

WHEREAS, the City and Recology Auburn Placer have incurred collection and delinquency costs on the above described delinquent properties; and

WHEREAS, City staff has established an administrative charge of \$40 per parcel for processing the delinquent accounts and recording the assessment lien; and

WHEREAS, the City has, on May 27, 2015, held a duly noticed public hearing and afforded each delinquent property owner identified on Exhibit A to this Resolution the right to object to and protest the assessment lien for delinquent collection charges and administrative fees; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed, considered, revised and corrected the delinquent accounts report as it deems just.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Colfax as follows:

- 1. The City Council hereby confirms the report of delinquent accounts attached as Exhibit A hereto and made a part hereof and hereby places a lien and levies a special assessment against said properties in the amounts described.
- 2. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to record a certified copy of the confirmed report with the Placer County Recorder. Exhibit A may be amended to delete or reduce any enumerated refuse collection service charges and administrative costs paid before the special assessments authorized by this Resolution are forwarded to the Placer County Recorder.
- 3. The City Clerk is hereby directed to deliver a copy of this Resolution to the Placer County Auditor-Controller who is authorized to cause the above amounts to be collected in the manner provided by law for the collection of ad valorem taxes and special assessments.
- 4. The Auditor-Controller of Placer County is requested to attach for collection on the County tax rolls those taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges listed on Exhibit A attached hereto.
- 5. The City warrants and represents that the taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges imposed by the City and being requested to be collected by Placer County comply with all requirements of state law, including but not limited to Articles XIIIC and XIIID of the California Constitution (Proposition 218).
- 6. The City releases and discharges County, and its officers, agents and employees from any and all claims, demands, liabilities, costs and expenses, damages, causes of action, and judgments, in any manner arising out of the collection by County on the property tax roll of any taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges on behalf of City.
- 7. In consideration for the County's collection of the charges through the County's property tax roll, the City agrees to and shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the County, its officers, agents and employees (the "Indemnified Parties") from any and all claims, demands, liabilities, costs and expenses, damages, causes of action, and judgments, in any manner arising out of the collection by County of any of City's said taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges requested to be collected by County for the City, or in any manner arising out of City's establishment and imposition of said taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges. City agrees that, in the event a judgment is entered in a court of law against any of the Indemnified Parties as a result of the collection of one of City's taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges, the County may offset the amount of the judgment from any other monies collected by County on behalf of City, including property taxes.
- 8. The City agrees that its officers, agents and employees will cooperate with the County by responding to all inquiries referred to City by County from any person concerning the City's taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges, and that City will not refer such persons to County officers and employees for response.

9. The City agrees to pay the County for the reasonable and ordinary charges to recoup its costs of placement and collection on the tax rolls at the agreed upon rate of 1% of the taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges, as provided by Government Code sections 29304 and 51800.

SUMMARY:

Colfax Municipal Code (the "Code") Title 13, Chapter 13.08, Article VI authorizes the City to collect delinquent sewer charges on the secured tax roll at the same time as general property taxes. The Code requires the City Council to adopt an Ordinance by a two-thirds vote in order to collect the delinquent charges on the tax roll.

There are approximately 73 delinquent sewer service charge accounts that remain unpaid. A written report containing a description of each parcel of real property for which there is a delinquent sewer service charge and the amount of each charge has been filed with the City Clerk and is attached. All charges reflected in the written report have been computed in conformity with Title 13, Chapter 13.08, Article III of the Code.

A public hearing is required before the proposed Ordinance can be adopted. Notice of the Public Hearing regarding the delinquent accounts was published in the Colfax Record once each week for two successive weeks prior to the hearing. A copy of the delinquent accounts report is on file at City Hall. All property owners with a delinquent balance were notified in writing of the public hearing process.

The purpose of the hearing is to allow the Council to hear objections and protests to the report. At the conclusion of the hearing, the Council may adopt, revise, change, reduce or modify any sewer service charge in the report, sustain or overrule any objections to the report and adopt or decline to adopt the report as modified. If the report is adopted with or without modification, the City Clerk will file it with the County Auditor-Controller and the charges reflected in the final report will be collected at the same time as ad valorem property taxes.

FISCAL IMPACT:

As indicated on the attached report, there are \$68,111.17 delinquent Sewer charges due to the City as of May 20, 2015.

BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS:

Placer County requires a resolution containing specific provisions to be adopted in order to collect the delinquent charges on the tax roll. The Colfax Code requires an ordinance.

CONCLUSION:

This process is cumbersome but essential to properly collecting delinquent sewer service charges on the tax roll.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF COLFAX AUTHORIZING COLLECTION OF DELINQUENT SEWER SERVICE CHARGES ON THE PLACER COUNTY SECURED AND UNSECURED TAX ROLL FOR FISCAL YEAR 2015-2016

The City Council of the City of Colfax does ordain as follows:

Section 1.

The Colfax City Council authorizes the collection of delinquent sewer services charges on the Placer County secured and unsecured tax roll as set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein.

Section 2. Superseding Provisions

The provisions of this ordinance and any resolution adopted pursuant hereto shall supersede any previous ordinance or resolution to the extent the same is in conflict herewith.

Section 3. Severability

If any section, phrase, sentence or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, the invalid or unconstitutional portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

Section 4. Effective Date

This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption.

Section 5. Publication

This ordinance shall, within 15 days after its adoption, be published or posted in accordance with Section 36933 of the Government Code of the State of California with the names of those City Council members voting for and against it.

Exhibit A

Recitals

This Ordinance has been enacted with regard to the following facts and circumstances:

- A. Colfax Municipal Code Title 13, Chapter 13.08, Article VI authorizes the City of Colfax ("City") to collect delinquent sewer services charges which have accrued on the secured and unsecured tax roll in the same manner and at the same time as general property taxes; and
- B. A written report attached as Exhibit B to this Ordinance (the "Report") containing a description of each parcel of real property receiving sewer services and the amount of delinquent charges for each parcel has been prepared and filed with the City Clerk in accordance with Colfax Municipal Code §13.08.320; and
- C. Notice of the filing of the Report and notice of the time and place of the hearing thereon by the City Council has been duly given and published as required by Colfax Municipal Code §13.08.330; and
- D. At the May 27, 2015 hearing the City Council heard and considered all objections and protests to the Report and determined that protests were not made by the owners of a majority of the separate parcels of property described in the Report; and
- E. At the conclusion of the hearing, after incorporating all revisions to the Report that the Council deemed necessary and after addressing or overruling all objections to the Report the Council found and determined that each charge as described in the Report is due, owing and unpaid; and
- F. The County has required as a condition of the collection of said charges that the City warrant the legality of said charges and defend and indemnify the County from any challenge to the legality thereof.

Ordinance

- 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct statements of fact and are hereby incorporated into this Ordinance.
- 2. The Report attached as Exhibit B hereto is adopted and said adoption is final. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to file with the Placer County Auditor-Controller a copy of this Ordinance and the Report.
- 3. The Auditor-Controller of Placer County is requested to attach for collection on the County tax rolls those taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges, listed on the Report attached as Exhibit B attached hereto.

- 4. The City warrants and represents that the taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges imposed by the City and being requested to be collected by Placer County comply with all requirements of state law, including but not limited to Articles XIIIC and XIIID of the California Constitution (Proposition 218).
- 5. The City releases and discharges the County, and its officers, agents and employees from any and all claims, demands, liabilities, costs and expenses, damages, causes of action, and judgments, in any manner arising out of the collection by County on the property tax roll of any taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges on behalf of City.
- 6. In consideration for the County's collection of the charge through the County's property tax roll, the City agrees to and shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the County, its officers, agents and employees (the "Indemnified Parties") from any and all claims, demands, liabilities, costs and expenses, damages, causes of action, and judgments, in any manner arising out of the collection by County of any of City's said taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges requested to be collected by County for the City, or in any manner arising out of City's establishment and imposition of said taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges. City agrees that, in the event a judgment is entered in a court of law against any of the Indemnified Parties as a result of the collection of one of City's taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges, the County may offset the amount of the judgment from any other monies collected by County on behalf of City, including property taxes.
- 7. The City agrees that its officers, agents and employees will cooperate with the County by responding to all inquiries referred to City by County from any person concerning the City's taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges, and that City will not refer such persons to County officers and employees for response.
- 8. The City agrees to pay the County for the reasonable and ordinary charges to recoup its costs of placement and collection on the tax rolls at the agreed upon rate of 1% of the taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges, as provided by Government Code sections 29304 and 51800.

REQUESTING COLLECTION OF SEWER SERVICE CHARGES ON THE PLACER COUNTY TAX ROLL FOR TAX YEAR 2015-2016

Whereas, Colfax Municipal Code Title 13, Chapter 13.08, Article VI authorizes the City of Colfax ("City") to collect delinquent sewer services charges which have accrued on the secured and unsecured tax roll in the same manner and at the same time as general property taxes; and

Whereas, a written report attached as Exhibit A to this Resolution (the "Report") containing a description of each parcel of real property receiving sewer services and the amount of delinquent charges for each parcel has been prepared and filed with the City Clerk in accordance with Colfax Municipal Code §13.08.320; and

Whereas, notice of the filing of the Report and notice of the time and place of the hearing thereon by the City Council has been duly given and published as required by Colfax Municipal Code §13.08.330; and

Whereas, at the May 27, 2015 hearing the City Council heard and considered all objections and protests to the Report and determined that protests were not made by the owners of a majority of the separate parcels of property described in the Report; and

Whereas, at the conclusion of the hearing, after incorporating all revisions to the Report that the Council deemed necessary and after addressing or overruling all objections to the Report the Council found and determined that each charge as described in the Report is due, owing and unpaid; and

Whereas, the County has required as a condition of the collection of said charges that the City warrant the legality of said charges and defend and indemnify the County from any challenge to the legality thereof,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Colfax as follows:

- 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct statements of fact and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution.
- 2. The Report attached as Exhibit A hereto is adopted and said adoption is final. The City Clerk is hereby directed to file with the Placer County Auditor-Controller a copy of this Resolution and the Report.
- 3. The Auditor-Controller of Placer County is requested to attach for collection on the County tax rolls those taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges, listed on the Report attached as Exhibit A attached hereto.

- 4. The City warrants and represents that the taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges imposed by the City and being requested to be collected by Placer County comply with all requirements of state law, including but not limited to Articles XIIIC and XIIID of the California Constitution (Proposition 218).
- 5. The City releases and discharges County, and its officers, agents and employees from any and all claims, demands, liabilities, costs and expenses, damages, causes of action, and judgments, in any manner arising out of the collection by County on the property tax roll of any taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges on behalf of City.
- 6. In consideration for the County's collection of the charge through the County's property tax roll, the City agrees to and shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the County, its officers, agents and employees (the "Indemnified Parties") from any and all claims, demands, liabilities, costs and expenses, damages, causes of action, and judgments, in any manner arising out of the collection by County of any of City's said taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges requested to be collected by County for the City, or in any manner arising out of City's establishment and imposition of said taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges. City agrees that, in the event a judgment is entered in a court of law against any of the Indemnified Parties as a result of the collection of one of City's taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges, the County may offset the amount of the judgment from any other monies collected by County on behalf of City, including property taxes.
- 7. The City agrees that its officers, agents and employees will cooperate with the County by responding to all inquiries referred to City by County from any person concerning the City's taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges, and that City will not refer such persons to County officers and employees for response.
- 8. The City agrees to pay the County for the reasonable and ordinary charges to recoup its costs of placement and collection on the tax rolls at the agreed upon rate of 1% of the taxes, assessments, fees and/or charges, as provided by Government Code sections 29304 and 51800.

ISSUE STATEMENT AND DISCUSSION:

The City finances are in improving shape. By the end of the current fiscal year, we expect to meet or exceed the General Fund reserve target established by City Council of \$325,000 (approximately 25% of annual General Fund expenditures).

The purpose of this Budget Review is to review and discuss the Fiscal Year 2015-2016 Adopted Budget for any currently identified revenue and expense differences. Staff is recommending some minor adjustments to the budget adopted in June 2014 as outlined below – with more details in the attached reports. <u>City of Colfax</u> Sales Tax Analysis – Fiscal Year 2015-2016 Budget Update June 2015

Revenue from Sales and Use taxes is approximately 59% of the overall General Fund Revenue (discretionary revenue) Budget for FY2014-2015. As reported in the Mid-Year Budget review in March, this percentage is higher than the average for most California Cities and indicates a high dependency on sales tax revenue for our City. Because this level of dependency is very difficult to estimate, it is financially prudent for the City to monitor sales tax revenues very closely.

FISCAL YEAR 2014-2015 ANALYSIS:

We have updated the attached sales tax analysis report through May 2015. This update includes all allocations from the State and County through March 2015. The City receives estimated advance payments approximately two months in arrears from the State and a true-up for each quarter approximately 90 days after quarter end. Allocations from the County for the "Triple Flip" (Sales tax for Property Tax Swap – Proposition 57) are received in January and May each year and are based on current year estimates provided by the Board of Equalization and adjusted for true-ups in previous years.

The adopted budget for fiscal year 2014-2015 reflected an approximately 25% decrease over the previous year. With receipts for just half of the year recorded thus far, we have already received over 100% of the annual budget. The increase is primarily due to increase in the portion of the sales tax received from the "Triple Flip". The "Triple Flip" includes advances for the current year and true-up adjustments from the previous year — and is therefore not actually reflective of current year activity.

<u>CALIFORNIA SALES AND USE TAX - (Information derived from The California Municipal Revenue Sources Handbook 2014 edition)</u>

California sales and use tax is the familiar tax that retailers add on to the price of most goods sold in California. A portion of the tax is a state tax and a portion is locally imposed. The State of California Legislature passed the Bradley-Burns Local Sales and Use Tax Law in 1955. As part of this law, a City may participate by imposing a sales and use tax rate of up to 1 percent. The basic 1 percent Bradley-Burns rate for Cities is a general tax and must be received in the General Fund.

Under California law, Local Transaction and Use Taxes may be approved locally and added to the combined state and local sales and use tax rate. Locally enacted transactions and use taxes may be levied as general taxes (unrestricted) or special taxes (restricted for a specific use). Senate Bill 566 which was made effective January 1, 2004, gave every county and every city the ability to seek voter approval of a local transaction and use tax increase under certain conditions. Those conditions (with amendments enacted since that time) are:

- 1. The transactions and use tax may be imposed at a rate of 0.125 percent or a multiple thereof;
- 2. The ordinance proposing the tax must be approved by a two-thirds vote of all members of the governing body;
- 3. If for general purposes, the tax must be approved by a majority vote of the voters in the city or county;
- 4. If for specific purposes, the tax must be approved by a two-thirds vote of the voters in the city or county; and
- 5. In most counties, the maximum combined (city and county) rate of transactions and use taxes in any location my not exceed 2 percent.

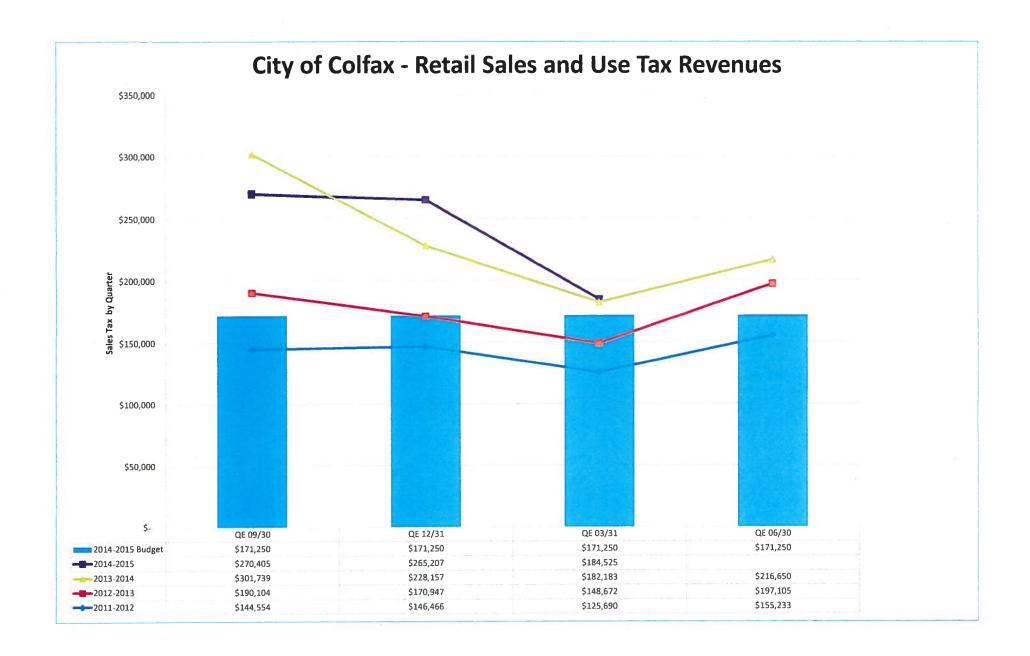
Altogether, as of October 2013, there are 117 cities (not including the city and county of San Francisco) with voter approved transactions and use tax rates. Additionally, there are 48 county or special district rates in 28 counties.

FISCAL YEAR 2015-2016 BUDGET:

The fiscal year 2015-2016 budget was conservatively developed consistent with actual revenues from previous years and current market information. Based on current year actuals and estimates provided by the Department of Finance (State Board of Equalization) we would expect sales tax revenues to be slightly higher than the current year with the exception of the monies received through the Triple Flip. Therefore, staff recommends increasing the 2015-2016 estimates by approximately 25%.

SUMMARY:

Staff recommends that the Council accepts and files the Sewer Service Fees for Fiscal Year 2015-2016.

BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS:

Colfax Municipal Code 13.08.160 Fee Adjustments - The sewer service fee, including lift station charges, shall be reviewed annually and amended by resolution of the city council when determined necessary.

Resolution No. 33 – 2008 (Attached)

Note 1: Sewer Base Rate will continue to increase by a 3.5% inflator every year beyond 2012-2013 unless modified by the Council. Additional rate increases may be necessary if costs exceed projections. Any such additional increases shall be subject to Prop 218.

Note 2: The Collection & Lift System rate is set at \$12.20 with future increases to be considered after the line assessment study is completed. Any such additional increases shall be subject to Prop 218.

RECOMMENDATION:

Based on current budget projections, staff recommends no change be made to the calculation of annual sewer service fees as approved in Resolution No. 33 - 2008.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLFAX SETTING WASTEWATER TREATMENT AND COLLECTION SYSTEM USER RATES

WHEREAS, the Colfax City Council has duly considered the monthly sewer rates necessary to fund:

- 1) maintenance and operations of the City's new wastewater treatment plant;
- 2) the debt service on a State Revolving Fund (SRF) loan for the construction of the new wastewater treatment plant; and
- 3) improvements required by the Central Valley Regional Water Quality Control Board to the collection system, including lift stations; and .

WHEREAS, the SRF loan has financed the construction of a new tertiary treatment facility that will produce effluent to meet standards and deadlines as set forth in the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) and Cease and Desist Order, both of which were approved by the Regional Water Quality Control Board in October 2007; and

WHEREAS, the Council has held a noticed public hearing and further multiple subsequent hearings and received a tremendous amount of community input; and

WHEREAS, the rate schedule attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit A, is intended to provide sufficient revenue through increases over the next 6 years to meet the obligations as set forth in Agreement Number: 07-836-550 (Project Number: C-06-4470-110) in the amount of \$7,485,865 and other requirements of the Regional Water Quality Control Board;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Colfax that the attached monthly sewer rate schedule and annual increases shown therein is approved to be effective January 1, 2009, subject to further proceedings pursuant to Proposition 218.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council finds that the uniform collection system rate provides for improvements and enhanced maintenance that allows the City to avoid spills and fines that benefits all users equally.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that a notice of the rate increases and justification therefore shall be mailed to all parties subject to the rate increases and a public hearing as

required by Proposition 218 to provide opportunity for protest of the rate increase shall be held on November 19, 2008 at 7:00 p.m. or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard.
