IDEAL CANDIDATE

The ideal candidate will have strong service motivation and possess a positive attitude to ensure a collaborative working environment. Strong communication and interpersonal skills are a must for this position, as is the ability to adhere to the safety protocols.

THE POSITION

This is a full-time, entry-level position in the Maintenance Worker Series. The position is distinguished from the Maintenance Worker II by the performance of the more routine tasks and duties assigned to the Maintenance Worker position. Employees at this level are not expected to perform with the same independence of direction and judgment on matters related to establishing procedures and guidelines as are positions allocated to the II level. Since this position is typically used as a training class, employees may have only limited or non-directly related experience.



CORE VALUES

Initiative – is taking independent action and/or creating opportunities to get the job done and prevent or resolve problems.

Respecting Differences – is understanding of the differences others bring as well as seeking and valuing others' input.

Accepting Responsibility – is holding oneself accountable for one's work or actions and striving for continuous improvement of the city's overall effectiveness.

Service Motivation – is committed to serve the public and to meet the needs of customers, fellow employees and the city. It means focusing one's efforts on finding out and meeting the needs of others. Shares information openly.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS (include, but not limited to the following)

Employees in this series may perform a variety of duties associated with the general maintenance of City streets, buildings, facilities and parks. Typical duties may include: the cleaning and sweeping of streets, sidewalks, parking lots, parks and other landscaped areas. Additionally, the employee may be assigned to check storm drains, culverts and ditches, operate tools and equipment to patch and repair streets alleys and public parking lots, construct and maintain gutters, sidewalks and other incidental improvements, perform cleaning and maintenance of sewer collection system, perform occasional maintenance as may be required at the wastewater treatment plant, conduct minor electrical and plumbing repairs, complete minor construction projects and light carpentry projects as assigned, clean public restrooms, mow, trim, plant, transplant irrigate and cultivate landscape and planted areas and collect and dispose of rubbish left along streets and highways. During the the winter may operate snow removal equipment.

LICENSES

» Possession of a valid California driver's license required.

TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE

- » Any combination of training and experience that has provided the knowledge, skills and abilities necessary for a Public Workers Maintenance Worker I.
- » High school diploma or equivalent.

» Monday through Friday - 7:00 A.M. - 3:30 P.M.

COMPENSATION AND BENEFITS

The salary for the Public Works Maintenance Worker I is \$20.11 – \$25.80/hour. Placement within this range is dependent upon qualifications and experience. The City also offers CalPERS retirement, health and dental benefits, EAP, life insurance and a generous leave package.
