





The brand version depends on its USE. Sometimes it becomes necessary to eliminate the border and background.



5. **COUNCIL, STAFF AND OTHER REPORTS**

5A. Committee Reports and Colfax Informational Items – All Councilmembers

Council Member Douglass reported on the Placer County and City Officials Dinner hosted by Colfax, a School Give-a-Way event at the Baptist Church, a meeting with Placer County Supervisor Cindy Gustafson, and the Policy and Innovation Committee with SACOG. He spoke about two Pioneer Community Energy meetings and further explained a rate increase vote that took place. He also announced the new pharmacy in town is open.

Mayor Pro Tem Mendoza reported on Governor Newsom's visit in Colfax, where he announced they are hiring 400 new firefighters to CalFIRE. She reported on the Placer County and City Officials Dinner in Colfax, the Heritage Trail through Dutch Flat, the meeting with Supervisor Gustafson where insurance cancellations and increases were discussed. She also spoke about the 2nd Annual Indian Days on August 24th at Sierra Vista Center, at 10am.

Mayor Fatula reported on the Colfax High School Kick-off day for opening day, Governor Newsom's visit, stating there will actually be 393 new firefighters being hired on to CalFIRE. He spoke about the Shaded Fuel Break, and the Placer County City Officials Dinner at the landfill site. He suggested looking into outdoor sports at the landfill location.

5B. City Operations Update – City Manager

City Manager Heathcock reported that on July 26th there was a lift station force main sewer break resulting in an estimated 22,000 gallons wastewater discharge. He spoke about potential fines from the Regional Water Board and the impacts of those fines. He also reported on a 6.5 million sewer grant application/ contract with the Regional Board, which will be out for review in 3 weeks. He estimates construction by next spring.

Mayor Fatula highlighted what this sewer grant could provide for the City.

5C. Agency Partner Reports

Sgt. Ty Conners, Colfax Station Commander, asked for a moment of silence for Officer Andre Moye, and gave details of the tragic situation in Riverside that led to his death. He spoke about the Colfax Facebook Group that is a subset of Placer County Sheriff's page, that provides information and allows for posts from public. He spoke about an officer staffing change (he will introduce the new Officer in to Council in September), mapping progress update, call and arrest stats, and he recognized staff for the PCCOA Dinner and the Governor's visit.

Council Member Lomen reported on behalf of Brian Eagan- Battalion Chief, CalFIRE, Placer County Fire, City of Colfax Fire Department. He reported on hydraulic rescue tools, annual recertification of fire gear, fire apparatus are all in working order, volunteers approved to provide fire apparatus and EMT at the Jr. Falcon Football games. He also provided updates on a grant, CalFIRE in the region, the Shaded Fuel Break and Fire activity.

Tim Ryan, Colfax Area Chamber of Commerce, reported on the Placer County City Officials Dinner, Summerfest, Railhead Grand Opening and Ribbon Cutting, Coffee and Conversation with Supervisor Gustafson, Railroad Days Fundraising Dinner, an upcoming Colfax Drug Company Grand Opening and Ribbon Cutting (8/21), the Chamber Mixer at Dutch Flat Hotel (8/27), and a new salon business on Depot Street. Conversation followed regarding local business trends.

Foxy McCleary, Colfax, reminded everyone of the VFW Breakfast on 2nd Sundays, Legion Dinner on 3rd Thursday, and a free yoga class at Sierra Vista. She spoke about the low attendance at the Railroad Days fundraiser.

Fred Abbott, Event Liaison for the City of Colfax, spoke about the Art Walk on the 16th, 3rd Annual Lions Car Show on 17th of August, Railroad Days Fundraiser, and the plans for the Railroad Day Event.

6. <u>COUNCIL BUSINESS</u>

6A. Contract Award for Culver Street Rehabilitation Project – Phase I

City Manager Wes Heathcock presented this item. He provided background and explained the project. He explained Simpson & Simpson was determined to be the lowest bidder, yet still higher than the engineers estimate. He explained the two different amounts in the actions requested.

Public Comment: Tim Ryan, resident of Colfax, asked about Culver Street past Newman Street.

City Manager Heathcock explained after Newman Street, this street becomes Pine Street. He explained the process and why this street was chosen for rehabilitation.

Council Member Burruss asked about the possible benefit of going back out to bid on the project.

Recommendation: Discuss and consider adopting a Resolution 36-2019 authorizing the City Manager to:

1. Award a construction contract to Simpson and Simpson Inc. in the amount of \$227,453 and authorize the City Manager to execute change orders up to the budgeted amount.

2. Adopt the total project budget for the Culver Street Rehabilitation Project – Phase I in the amount of \$307,045.

City Manager Wes Heathcock presented this item. He provided background and explained the RFQ process conducted.

Mayor Fatula asked how this contract compares with the current contract with Coastland Consulting Services.

City Manager Heathcock explained this contract and services included. He also spoke about the positive history with this firm and the roundabout project.

Recommendation: Discuss and consider adopting a Resolution 38-2019 authorizing the City Manager to enter into a Contract Agreement with GHD for City Engineering services for a term of 3-year with an option for a 2-year extension.

9. <u>GOOD OF THE ORDER</u>

City Manager Heathcock gave an update on the roundabout project.

Council Member Douglass spoke about the caboose being open this weekend to the public and warned every one of gas thieves in the area.

Mayor Pro Tem Mendoza spoke about her recent travel over 7 states, visiting national parks, attending events, including a mock disaster preparedness event with a pancake breakfast with over 700 volunteers. She also spoke about microbusiness licensing for cannabis and suggested a committee to look at this issue, **a consensus of the Council referred this item to staff to form this committee and bring back at the next Council meeting.** Both Mayor Pro Tem Mendoza and Lomen would like to be committee members. She also spoke about her friend Robert Wells, National Security Advisor, who helped get the old stagecoach maps. She said he will be doing a book signing on Oct 20th in the Council Chambers, from 2-3pm. She reminded everyone of the September 5-8th Gold Country Fair in Auburn.

Council Member Lomen introduced Officer Nave and asked if he would like to provide an agency report. Officer Nave, CHP, announced Caltrans is closing Hwy 50 between the end of September and early Oct, Placerville to Myers for bridge work and the impact on Highway 80. Officer Nave was asked to write a short article for Colfax Connections.

Mayor Fatula spoke about concerns over sewer billing. Mayor Pro Tem Mendoza and Mayor Fatula volunteered for the subcommittee assignment. Committee will meet with the new city engineers (GHD) about sewer rates, and will report back in a month.

As there was no further business on the agenda, Mayor Fatula adjourned the meeting, without objection, at 7:13 PM.

Summary/Background

These monthly financial reports include General Fund Reserved Cash Analysis Graphs and the City of Colfax Cash Summary Report (with supporting documentation). The reports are prepared monthly on a cash basis and are reconciled to the General Ledger accounting system, previous reports, and bank statements. Detailed budget comparisons are provided as a mid-year report and also as part of the proposed budget process each year.

The purpose of these reports is to provide status of funds and transparency for Council and the public of the financial transactions of the City.

The attached reports reflect an overview of the financial transactions of the City of Colfax in July 2019. Monthly highlights include:

- Fiscal year 2018-2019 budgeted fund transfers have been completed and posted to the ending cash balances reported for June 2019.
- Cash balance increases for June included:
 - Fund 385 Roundabout project. The balance of the Developer Road Improvements in the amount of \$84,000 was received and recorded in July. Note: The first payment on the Construction contract will be processed in August and will be immediately submitted for reimbursement from Caltrans.
- Negative cash fund balances are due to timing of funding allocations and reimbursements.
 - Fund 250 The request for Fiscal year funding via Placer County Transportation Agency (PCTPA) will be submitted as soon as allocations are approved by the PCTPA Board (scheduled for August Board meeting). Full funding of budgeted transfers from Gas Tax Fund and General Fund will be recorded in fiscal year end closing process (June 2020).







Summary/Background

Over the years, the Colfax Hotel (10 Grass Valley Street) was primarily used for lodging with varying levels of commercial business use on the bottom floor. The past 30+ years the building has been unoccupied, thereby, reducing the economic strength of the downtown area.

The City of Colfax was recently approached by a potential buyer (Aziz) for the Colfax Hotel asking if council would support converting the building into apartments on all floor levels. Aziz has experience turning commercial buildings into multi-residential use in the Sacramento area. The concept is to create 450 ft² apartments in the \$850-\$950 rent range. Based on the square footage, the building would have approximately 21 residential units.

Staff did request the potential buyer look at the first floor use as restaurant space as part of their concept. Aziz's realtor stated based on their calculations the property owner would need to charge 2.30/ft² for the restaurant space to turn a profit. The prime commercial space on the I-80 corridor is charging 1.25/ft² for the same commercial use. Ideally, the multi-commercial use would create the best outcome for the downtown economy. Conversely, the necessary cost to retain a restaurant on the first floor does not appear to be sustainable; therefore, the commercial use as apartments only is a more viable option for the building.

Staff is requesting council discuss and provide direction on the proposed Colfax Hotel business use concept.
