Summary/Background

At the time of the pandemic two outdoor dining areas were put in place because indoor dining had been prohibited. One was located outside the Railhead and the other was located in front of Grandma Cs. The area in front of the Railhead has been removed, but the outdoor dining area in front of the business formally known as Grandma Cs, now the location of Snapdragon Provisions and Bloomin' Mountain Flowers, is still in place and is in need of a complete makeover.

During the 2024 City budget meetings, the city council allocated \$25,000 for new fencing with the understanding that the remaining outdoor dining area is temporary until the city can find funding for the Downtown Connectivity Plan which calls for shifting parking and the road center line of North Main Steet to provide gathering space along business frontage, adding a roundabout on the North end of the historic downtown area, and relocating the Caboose to the grass area next to the museum.

Caroline McCully, President of Railroad Days non-profit was successful in obtaining a \$10,000 grant from Union Pacific to help rehabilitate the remaining outdoor dining area.

At today's special meeting, the council will hear from business owners and community members regarding their concerns about materials and designs of the outdoor dining area. Following this discussion, the item will be brought back to a regular city council meeting for a vote.

Each space will Be approximately 21 feet wide.

Gates would be Installed in each of the 3 divider fences




OPTION 2 -2 SPACES
