CHS Girls Win Nor Cal Title With 34-2 Record



As the #1 seed, the Colfax Lady Falcons were able to play on their home court for the Nor Cal final game. The opponent was Caruthers High School from Fresno County, a school with a similar enrollment to Colfax. The home team fought its way to a win close game, 53-52. Juliette James led the Falcons with 16 points.

This 34th win is a program "best" for the Lady Falcons. After this game, the ladies were the only Sacramento area team still playing and advanced to the State Final to play Rancho-Cucamunga's Los Osos High School at the Golden I Center.

Colfax lost the State Final in a game that was closer than the 65-48 final score suggested, especially considering the difference in size between the two schools.

Mendoza Takes Medical Leave From City Council Duties

The Colfax City Council met once in March on the 8th for a short meeting that lasted barely 30 minutes. Councilmember David Ackerman was not at the meeting.

Mayor Pro Tem Marnie Mendoza was also absent, but she constituted the one piece of official business on the night's agenda when she was granted a six-week leave of absence for medical reasons. She is expected to return on April 12.

Councilmember Kim Douglass was appointed interim Mayor Pro Tem during Mendoza's absence on a 3-0 vote. April 2023 council meetings are scheduled for the 12th and 26th.



LIHWAP stands for the Low Income Household Water Assistance Program.

LIHWAP offers a one-time payment to help you pay your water or wastewater bills.

LIHWAP can help you if you're past due on your water bill or even if you're current on payments.

LIHWAP helps pay bills accrued **anytime**. There are no date restrictions.

How Do I Apply?

Households can apply for LIHWAP assistance through a local LIHWAP service provider. Eligibility for LIHWAP services can vary depending on income, water system participation, place of residence, and other factors. Households whose utility payments are included in their rent may also be eligible for LIHWAP. Recipients of CalFresh, CalWORKs, and LIHEAP are automatically income-qualified for LIHWAP assistance. Contact your local LIHWAP service provider to learn more about how to apply by visiting csd.ca.gov/waterbill.

What Can I Qualify For?

LIHWAP provides one-time payments to low-income households that are eligible for assistance. The size of a benefit will vary depending on the household's residential water and wastewater bills. In addition, program participation is limited to households receiving services from water and wastewater providers enrolled in LIHWAP to receive the payment of assistance benefits. Households that qualify for LIHWAP could reduce their water or wastewater charges by hundreds, or even thousands of dollars depending on their bill.

If you are struggling to afford your water or wastewater bills, please visit **csd.ca.gov/waterbill** to see if you qualify for payment assistance through LIHWAP and to find the local service provider near you to apply.

Overcrowding At Placer Animal Services Center



Recent stormy weather has led to an increase in dog intakes at the Placer County Animal Services (PCAS) Center in Auburn, putting additional strain on an alreadyfull shelter.

In the first two weeks of March alone, the shelter took in 73 new dogs, more than 60% higher than normal for this time of year.

The pace of adoptions and redemptions has not kept up, and as a result, the shelter is experiencing overcrowding, with many overflow dogs placed in crates in spare rooms, doubled up in kennels and even housed in barn stalls.

"We're asking the public to take some precautions to ensure your pup stays safe at home during weather events," said Katie Ingram, PCAS program manager. "We're also pleading with owners to redeem their lost pets, and for other community members to open their homes and hearts for adoption if they can."




